A PROMISE OF SHELTER & DIGNITY

We are a small, faith-led logistics team based in Colorado, committed to solving street-level suffering caused by a lack of shelter. With humility and clarity, we bring forward a national solution: single-occupancy, mobile shelter trailers, designed for safety, dignity, and simplicity. These units aren't a charity project. They're national infrastructure, built to last and operate without corruption, politics, or red tape.

We will never ask for your money. We won't ask for your time. What we ask is simple: read this proposal. And if it makes sense, share it with others. That's how movements begin.

This is about restoring peace in our communities, dignity to those forgotten, and safety for everyone. One shelter at a time. One life at a time. We do this to honor Jesus Christ.



THIS IS ALL - OR NOTHING

We now have the means to build a real solution to street-level suffering, but only if we act with unity and urgency. This proposal asks the federal government to reallocate a portion of the funds already being spent on emergency rooms, policing, and jails, and invest it upstream in clean, safe, scalable shelters.

This is not about charity or politics. It's about logistics. A small, transparent team will manage and report everything in real time. We either act now or keep paying the high cost of doing nothing.



A WORD FROM THE FOUNDER

Let me start by saying this shouldn't be necessary. Most people don't want to think about homelessness. But we all care about our families, our neighborhoods, our churches. That's why we're asking you to give this a few minutes.

We're not here for donations or volunteer sign-ups. We're asking you to look at the suffering on our streets and ask: have we been doing this the wrong way? Could there be a simpler, smarter, more loving solution?



THE REAL PROBLEM: APATHY

The biggest threat isn't a lack of money. It's that we've stopped caring. Many of us are tired of broken promises, wasted money, and failed programs. But the cost of apathy is too high.

Right now, we spend about \$100 per night, per person in indirect costs: ER visits, police response, jail time, cleanups. That's over \$36,000 per year, and people are still on the street.

The answer isn't another house. It's a safe, clean place to rest without chaos or danger. And it starts with caring again.

FACING REALITY: WHO NEEDS HELP

Not everyone on the street wants a home. Some people are deep in addiction, mental illness, or simply detached. They won't thrive in traditional housing.

This program isn't about promising a perfect future. It's about reducing harm. It's about giving people a clean, private place to survive without hurting themselves or others.

THERE ARE TWO MAIN GROUPS:



Those in chronic crisis, unlikely to reintegrate without major support.



Those in temporary crisis who can bounce back if given safe shelter.

THIS SOLUTION WORKS FOR BOTH.

THE SYSTEM IS BROKEN

There are wonderful nonprofits doing great work. But others have lost their mission. Some have become more focused on marketing than people. The result? A system overwhelmed and underperforming.

We don't want to replace good organizations. We want to relieve the pressure on them. This program provides a clean, scalable way to stabilize people quickly so deeper help can follow.

We follow one rule: **one person per shelter**. No group settings. No risk of violence or trauma. Just peace.

We answer to God, not donors or trends. We keep our operations small, clear, and focused. No ads. No hype. Just help.

WHY THIS MATTERS EVEN IF YOU DON'T CARE

You may think this doesn't affect you. But when people have nowhere to go, they go somewhere. Often to public parks, storefronts, and emergency rooms.

This is about common sense. A \$24-a-night shelter saves taxpayers thousands. It reduces crime, public messes, and ER visits. It's better for everyone.



A NIGHT IN DENVER

Picture a freezing night. Shelters are full. A veteran with PTSD refuses to go inside. Too loud, too dangerous. He ends up in the ER with frostbite, costing thousands in emergency care.

Meanwhile, an ambulance is delayed, and your loved one doesn't make it.

That's not just sad. It's preventable.

A mobile shelter could have changed that.

LET'S BE HONEST

We've talked about apathy, cost, corruption, and chaos. So now we ask:
Can we finally build a simple, honest, national shelter system?
We believe the answer is yes. We're not asking for money. Just your attention.

Let's do this. For each other.



THE ONE-PERSON- PER-SHELTER RULE

WHY IT MATTERS:

Safety – Less violence, theft, and fear.

Dignity – Privacy allows rest and recovery.

Control – One person cannot endanger others.

Public Peace – Clear boundaries between suffering and public life.

Real Impact – These aren't homes. They're lifelines.

This rule is the foundation. It keeps people safe and systems manageable.

BUILT FOR SAFETY & ACCESS

EACH SHELTER INCLUDES:

- Remote monitoring
- A digital entry system
- 72-degree climate control
- Secure single occupancy

Dispatchers verify entries and enforce safety standards.

PUBLIC RESTROOM

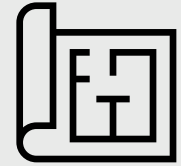
Clean, maintained, and open to the public.

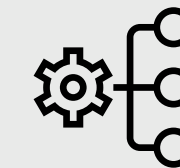

SAFE HAVEN OPTION

Each trailer offers a secure, anonymous drop-off compartment for infants, pets, or vulnerable individuals. It's monitored and alerts emergency responders instantly.

TRANSPARENT & ACCOUNTABLE

Everything is tracked in real time:

- **NO HIDDEN COSTS**
- **NO DONATIONS**
- **NO INFLATED OVERHEAD**

Just honest work, real data, and clear outcomes.

THE NUMBERS

- **\$48 PER SHELTER, PER DAY**
- **1 MILLION SHELTERS**
- **\$17.52 BILLION ANNUALLY**

This is far less than what we already spend on emergency services. And it works.

If it doesn't work, we donate the trailers to local governments.

But we believe it will.

Because it's simple. Because it's honest. Because it meets people where they are.

We already have the tools. The only thing missing is action.
